

Scope of Practice, Job Responsibilities and Duties of BCEHS Paramedics

Effective Date: July 15, 1996

All BCEHS Paramedics are required to:

- 1. Work as team members and portray professional attitudes in the performance of duties.
- 2. With regard to ambulances:
 - Maintain a thorough knowledge of roadways within the geographic area of responsibility;
 - b) Be responsible for vehicle security;
 - c) Drive with due care;
 - d) Inspect the vehicle before and after each shift and immediately report any damage and/or malfunction. (Call-out staff are not required to make a special trip at the beginning of their on-call shift);
 - e) Check and/or restock the ambulance supplies after each call or shift as required, and;
 - f) Clean and disinfect the ambulance and its equipment after each call or shift as required
- 3. Complete required forms as directed by BCAS policy and procedures.
- 4. Maintain current knowledge of standards, policy and procedure manuals, JLMC decisions and directives from management.
- 5. Attend briefing sessions/meetings as required and authorized.
- 6. Undertake training programs to upgrade skills as required and per the Collective Agreement.
- 7. Maintain certification requirements per the Collective Agreement and EMA Licensing Branch policy
- 8. With regard to ambulance stations:
 - a) Be responsible for station security, and;
 - b) Maintain the station and facilities in tidy and clean working order.
- 9. Maintain cooperative relationship with other BCAS personnel, members of other emergency agencies and hospital staff.
- 10. Communicate effectively with patients, their family members and associates.
- 11. Supervise observers on car and/or trainees, as required.
- 12. Perform other assigned or related duties.
