PHSA Research Conflict of Interest

Publication and Presentation Statements

One way to manage a perceived, potential or real conflict of interest (COI) is to disclose financial interests and external relationships in meetings, symposia, conference presentations or journal publications, when relevant. This provides a level of transparency and protects the integrity of your research. If you do not have any conflicts of interest to disclose, it is also important to provide this information in any poster, presentation, publication, etc. For example, including a slide in a presentation that states, "I have no conflicts to disclose."

The following are examples of disclosure statements that can be modified to fit your specific relationships and external interests. You should verify with the presentation/publication organization as to how they may wish to have the disclosure phrased.

- 1. The author(s) of this [publication, presentation, poster, etc.] has research support from [entity] and also [holds stock in, services on an advisory board for, services on the board of directors of, received an honorarium from, etc.] [entity]. This interest has been reviewed and approved by Provincial Health Services Authority in accordance with its policy on conflicts of interest in research.
- 2. The author(s) of this [publication, presentation, poster, etc.] consults for [entity] on [subject]. The author(s) also conducts research in areas of interest similar to the business interests of [entities]. This interest has been reviewed and approved by Provincial Health Services Authority in accordance with its policy on conflicts of interest in research.
- 3. The author(s) of this [publication, presentation, poster, etc.] was a [speaker for, consultant to, received an honorarium from][entity]. This interest has been reviewed and approved by Provincial Health Services Authority in accordance with its policy on conflicts of interest in research.
- 4. The studies reported in this [publication, presentation, poster, etc.] were supported by a grant from [NIH, CIHR, etc.]. The [principal investigator, author, speaker, etc.] [holds stock in, serves on an advisory board or board of directors for] [entity]. Although a financial conflict of interest was identified for management based on the overall scope of the project and its potential benefit to [entity], the research findings included in this [publication, presentation, or poster] may not necessarily relate to the interests of [entity].
